

UNDERGROUND CABLE REPAIRS

Hydro One is working in your neighbourhood

September 2022

Hydro One is completing repairs to a damaged underground transmission cable along Queens Quay between York Street and Lower Jarvis Street. As part of this work, you may notice an increase in noise and vehicular activity along this section of the Harbourfront.

We take our responsibility to your neighbourhood seriously and crews are working as quickly as possible while trying to minimize impact to the surrounding area.

WHAT TO EXPECT



Timing

- Emergency work began mid-August and we anticipate repairs will continue over the next several weeks.
- Work will take place between Monday and Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Occasional afterhours or weekend work may be required.



Work Sequence

- Crews are currently working along Queens Quay at Yonge Street, and will complete final repairs along Queens Quay at the following intersections: York Street, Freeland Street and Lower Jarvis Street.



Temporary Interruptions

- Temporary restrictions along sections of the south sidewalk, eastbound driving lane and the two-way bike lane on Queens Quay will be required.
- As crews work along Queens Quay at Yonge Street:
 - There will be no left turns from Queens Quay West northbound onto Yonge Street.
 - A temporary bike lane will support cyclists and pedestrians.
- Staff will direct traffic during the weekdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Signage will be in place to re-direct cyclists, vehicles and pedestrians.

Everything starts with safety. We recognize there has been increased activity in your neighbourhood and we thank you for your patience as crews complete repairs.
