

Construction Work Update

March 20, 2024

Overnight Watermain Work at the Yonge Street and The Esplanade and Lake Shore Blvd. Intersections

Contract: 22ECS-LU-02TT Start: Sunday, March 24, 2024 (9:00 p.m.) End: Thursday, March 28, 2024 (6:00 a.m.)

Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto's work on Yonge Street continues and this notice is to provide you with an update on the watermain project and the overnight work that will be undertaken by the contractor.

From Sunday, March 24 at 9 p.m. to Thursday, March 28 at 6 a.m., the contractor will carry out the required night work on the new Yonge Street watermain infrastructures.

Each evening, work will begin at 9:00 p.m. and continue until the next morning at 6:00 a.m. The Contractor is being permitted to work 24 hours a day until the work is completed and to perform the work overnight, in order to reduce the overall impact to traffic through these two intersections and complete preparations for the new water connection points to local properties.

When the necessary overnight work is completed, regular work hours will resume.

Your patience and understanding is appreciated during these disruptions.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Heavy equipment (eg. Hydrovac truck, sawcut machine, backhoe and construction vehicles) will be operated during construction period, and you may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce these impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The water services on Yonge Street will be temporarily impacted on the evening of Wednesday, March 27th., from 9:00pm to 6:00am.
 - Residents are encouraged to prepare for this interruption of water services.
- Work crews will avoid the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water, and telecom/cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Vehicular traffic travelling north and south on Yonge Street past The Esplanade intersection will not be impacted.

The intersection access to/from The Esplanade and Yonge Street will be closed on Sunday March 24th & Monday March 25th from the hours of 9:00pm to 6:00am



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Vehicular access to/from The Esplanade and Yonge Street will not be permitted on these specific days and hours.

Traffic at the Lake Shore Blvd W and Yonge Street intersection will be reduced to a single lane west bound from Tuesday March 26th & Wednesday March 27th between the hours of 9:00pm to 6:00am.

Traffic on Lake Shore Blvd E and Yonge Street will not be impacted.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will remain open at all times.



Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Traffic on Yonge Street and the intesections of The Esplanade and Lake Shore Blvd. will be reduced to one lane. There is no on-street parking on the affected areas of Yonge Street (northbound and southbound lanes) during the construction period.

Motorists, please obey traffic flagging personnel and their directions.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the **Field Ambassador** listed below.
